

PARISH NEWS

Easter Egg Hunt Sunday, April 9 immediately after the Rite II (10:00 AM) service. As in previous years, a "special" area will be roped off for our youngest Easter Egg hunters. Typically, lots of filled plastic eggs are hidden in the church's cemetery grounds. Eggs can be filled with candy, jelly beans, coins, trinkets, or other kid-friendly items. We currently have plenty of empty plastic eggs left over from previous years. There is no need to buy more plastic eggs!

Parishioners are invited to either:

- 1. Make a donations of fillings for these eggs.
- 2. Make a monetary donations to buy such egg fillings
- 3. Stop by the church anytime beginning on Palm Sunday, April 2 and pick up some empty plastic eggs to fill themselves. There will be a plastic bin containing bags of empty plastic eggs just inside the church.

PLEASE drop off any filled eggs (in a separately marked container) just inside the church by Good Friday, April 7 so we'll be all set to hide eggs early Easter Sunday morning. Help is needed to hide these eggs, so please volunteer!



RECTOR'S NEWS

Father Peter Ackerman



Spring is associated with blooming, and I feel that this season at hand serves as a good metaphor for where we are as a parish today. At Christ Church, Chaptico, there is a lot of "new" blooming around us. There is yours truly, a new rector/priest; a new directory and communication platform called Realm; new people coming to our Sunday services; and even a new attempt here at a newsletter.

New is often exciting, however newness also invites change. Such is the case with our newsletter (more about this note below)! There are also adjustments in ministries. We will offer a post 10am service Easter Egg Hunt this year, and though we will not have, as it seems from our past, hundreds of children hunting, we can still put our efforts in for the dozen or more, give or take who will join us this year. Alterations in expectations, like our Easter Egg Hunt, or not having a communications staff member (or any full time office staff) should not signify failure, just because it is different, and we adjust. Instead, both of these examples offer us opportunities to learn to be authentic in who we are as The Body of Christ today.

Living authenticity is made possible through our Vestry. At the retreat in January they determined that "Engagement" was the operative word for this year. We engage with those who go here, invite them back to worship and participation, and find ways to engage the wider community. For instance, it was that engagement idea is what inspired Julie Burch to produce this seasonal newsletter, and I am grateful for her efforts! Our desires, our ages, our strengths, can and will all be used by God today, as long as we focus God's will for us as we are, and not who we wish we were.

In short, we are a priest and people here in Chaptico. We have been together only a few months, and if I do say so myself, we are beginning well. More than one new worshipper has come to me in recent months and remarked "Wow, you have a real Episcopal Church here!" When I invited the most recent person to unpack that statement, I learned that at the heart of the comment was appreciation of the worship services we offer, and the genuine, friendly nature of our congregation. This news is good news, and I can already sense God working within us, forming us to carry out God's will in our locality.

As we continue on in our first year as priest and people, my hope for us is that we will continue to bloom, in areas familiar, and in regions new, so that we remain always living members of God's will for us as The Body of Christ, as Christ Church Chaptico, today.


