Covenant for Regathering in Worship

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, I promise, with God's help and to the best of my ability, to abide by the guidelines of the Diocese of Washington for participation in the life of my congregation according to the regathering phase in which my congregation is authorized to carry out its mission and ministry.

In fulfillment of our Baptismal Covenant, I will strive to:

Love my neighbor as myself

- Wear a mask or scarf over my nose and mouth at all times in church buildings, except momentarily to receive the sacrament or lead worship through an assigned speaking part.
- Only attend worship and receive communion if I am healthy and non-symptomatic with the novel coronavirus or any other transmittable disease that could compromise the health of another congregant;

Respect the dignity of every human being

- Make no physical contact with people beyond the members of my own household.
- Maintain a six foot or more distance from others in the congregation.
- Respect any requests for distance, masking, cleaning, to ensure the safety and comfort level of others, even as restrictions are reduced.

Seek and serve Christ in all people

- Trust and support the decisions of our congregational leaders.
- Stay connected with others in my community by telephone, email, video chat, or mail.

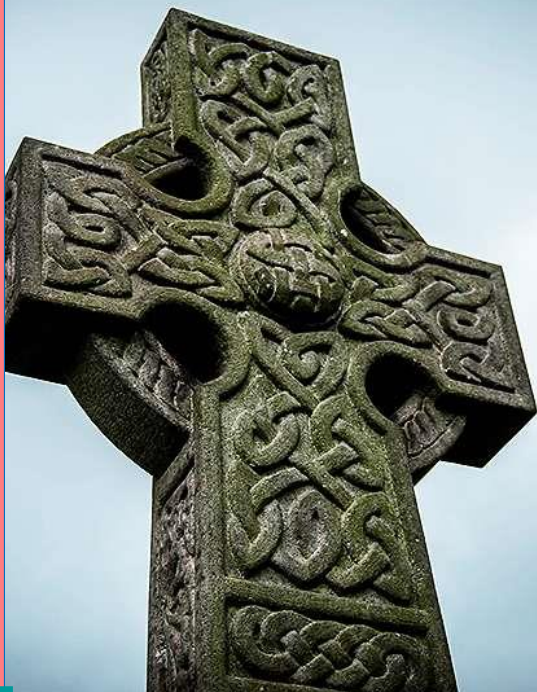



REFLECTIONS ON THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS

(JUNE 14, 2020) —THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST (PROPER 6, YEAR A)

Welcome to Christ Church. The three readings today provide us with insight into who we are as the people of God. The Gospel reading is the account of the calling and commissioning of the twelve apostles. They are sent forth with the message of God's Kingdom. Later Jesus will send larger groups to proclaim the good news and after his resurrection, he sends all of us into the world to bear the message.



The first reading continues the story of Abraham and Sarah. Many years have passed; still God's promise to give them a son has not been fulfilled and Sarah is now too old.

However, God comes to them and renews the promise. Sarah laughed at the idea but in the twenty-first chapter, we learn the son was born. He was called Isaac, which is Hebrew for "a laughing matter."



Today's reading from Romans tells us something else about our identity. We are a people who have been reconciled with God through Jesus' death. As Paul states in the chapter that follows, we have been incorporated into that death by baptism and thus our reconciliation with God is complete.

As a people called to proclaim good news, to live lives reconciled to God, and to be the holy priesthood of the new covenant, we gather to celebrate the mysteries of that covenant. The Eucharistic meal also reveals us as a people, like Abraham and Sarah who meet God in holy meals and find ourselves called by God into community with God.

Meet Our Episcopal Service Corps (ESC) Programs: Johnson Service Corps

Johnson Service Corps (JSC) is a diverse, ecumenical community of young adults ages 21 to 28 dedicated to service and social justice in Chapel Hill and Durham, N.C. Offering transformative opportunities for young adults to re-imagine vocational discernment, JSC helps Corps Members lead and live in ways that flow with their unique calling.

The JSC philosophy rests on four pillars:

1. **Servant Leadership:** On Fridays, Corps Members receive leadership training in the Servant Leadership model. They participate in an eight-week Servant Leadership course, and upon completion, have the opportunity to develop and facilitate a Servant Leadership workshop offered to the wider JSC community. At the conclusion of the course, Corps Members also visit Church of the Saviour, Washington, D.C., to experience first-hand how servant leadership practice has created a unique and inspiring faith community.
2. **Social Justice:** JSC members work with neighbors, from the local to the global, to stand against injustice in social, cultural, economic, political, and institutional systems, creating, instead systems of equity. Each Corps Member is matched with a local partner organization where they serve 32 hours/week. Current and past partner organizations provide services in the areas of highest need, including homelessness, substance abuse and addiction recovery, mental illness, health care, conflict mediation, job readiness, literacy, women's issues, affordable housing, financial policy, food access and nutrition, immigration, and childhood readiness. In addition, Corps Members participate in trainings and workshops about social justice issues, including anti-racism training.
3. **Intentional Community Living:** Corps Members live together in an intentional community of 4-6 people. During orientation, the community is led through a process of forming a "Community Covenant," outlining their intentions and values around life together during the year. Community life also includes three meals together weekly, a weekly meeting of spiritual sharing, a weekly house business meeting, as well as retreats and outings just for fun. Corps Members often point to intentional community living as the most transformative experience of the year.
4. **Spiritual Formation:** In a culture where everything seems to come in an ever-changing "flavor of the week," commitment to a daily practice and regular spiritual community can be a profound experience. Rooted in the contemplative and social justice practices of Christian tradition, JSC welcomes and embraces people of all spiritual expressions who seek to journey in discernment and discovery of ways to live out call authentically. JSC also provides a mentor for each Corps Member.

Episcopal Service Corps is a network of young adults ages 21-32 serving through locally organized intentional communities that are dedicated to: Serving others in solidarity; Promoting justice in community; Deepening spiritual awareness; Discerning vocation; and Living simply. Everyone serving through ESC commits to a household Rule of Life and regular spiritual direction, discernment and community practices. During their #ServiceYear, Corps members receive housing, health coverage, and small stipends to cover living expenses, transportation and food.
