<u>Retiring the Sipper Cups</u> - At the end of October we will retire the Communion sipper cup option for the remainder of the year. One of the reasons is to get us comfortable without, so that when we have services with larger attendance (Christmas Eve) we will not run out. The sipper cup option we use was not made for use in The Episcopal Church as there is no way to quickly refill the distribution platter. Fr. Peter reminds the congregation that participants who take only one of the elements (i.e. the wafer) receive the benefits of both (wafer and wine). So, whether congregants sip, or carefully dip the wafer, or abstain from the wine, each receives the "full" Eucharist.

<u>Acolytes!</u> We are putting out the word that we would like to see if any of our young people (4th grade on up) would like to serve as an Acolyte. The Acolyte carries the cross at our services and assists the priest at the altar table. If you are interested and willing to serve about one service per month please reach out to Fr. Peter or parishioner Monty Wright. Fr. Peter will do training with any and all persons who are interested in possibly serving..
