Dear Parish Family at Christ Church:

In Charles Dickens historical novel *A Tale of Two Cities* we read, "It is the best of times, it is the worst of times." Some may say this appropriately characterizes our parish as we prepare to enter 2019. On the one hand, the Holy Spirit is moving in this place in some amazing ways. The energy is palpable as we gather to worship, do outreach or to socialize. We are on the road to becoming an even more vibrant community of faith that God desires us to be, in large part, because of the commitment shown by our enthusiastic and gifted members.

Despite all that I just said, we are facing a significant challenge as we move into 2019, namely our operating income. Our projected expenses for 2019 are approximately \$208,000. This includes: utilities, salaries and benefits, maintenance, and supplies. However, to date we have only received commitments from 50 households in the amount of \$121,324. We also project to receive an additional \$33,500 from other sources such as recorded contributions and hall rental. If we were to solely plan reliant upon commitments received as of today (12/14), our total income will be \$154,824. If this information remains unchanged, we will unfortunately have to adopt a \$53,176 deficit budget for 2019. The sky isn't falling. This situation can be very easily turned around with your help and concern.

Did you know, but our parish has 105 active households with 179 "*Communicants in Good Standing*" as defined by church law? Our average Sunday attendance continues to go up over the past few years and more and more parishioners are feeling inspired and empowered to take risks to give birth to new ministries. This is an exciting time for my family and me to be here because Christ Church is poised to do some really great things in God's name!

I am extremely grateful to all who have made a financial commitment for the coming year. As I have said before, your generosity allows us to do so much good work within our parish and local community.

For those of you who have not made a specific financial commitment to Christ Church in the coming year, **we truly need your help**. Please make an investment in Christ Church by becoming a partner with those who have made a commitment. Rest assure that the Vestry, staff, and I are committed to finding ways to control our operating expenses.

Thank you for prayerful consideration of this important matter and for partnering with our parish. As move into a new year, may we be equipped and ready for ministry in a world hungering to know God's love.





Read Luke 1:57-80. Name three ways in which your faith community challenges you to practice the Way of Love. Share your list with a member of your community.

Wednesday, December 19

PRAY

Gather with your faith community for a short time of prayer today.

Thursday, December 20

BLESS

Identify a blessing you have that you could give away. Then share this blessing with your church, a local ministry, or your community.

Friday, December 21

TURN

Read the General Confession in an unfamiliar location—in the park, at work, at school, or on the bus. What does the prayer invite you to turn from in that location? What does it invite you to turn toward?

Saturday, December 22

REST

How can you or your community open yourselves to people in need of rest and relief from overwork? From oppression? From violence?
